Constantly updating privacy laws have implications for any business which utilises telematics for the location of its company vehicles. With laws varying from state to state, employers need to know what they need to do to comply with laws protecting their drivers' personal privacy.

## HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

Employers are legally obliged to not undertake



**TRACKING SURVEILLANCE** on an employee when they are using a company vehicle outside of work hours.

As it is unlawful for companies to track drivers during their personal time. This means their location data cannot be **OBSERVED OR STORED** during private trips.



EROAD's Ehubo2 allows drivers to select a "private" mode for **PERSONAL TRIPS**.

A simple button can be pressed before making a trip to determine whether it's for work or private.



Drivers should select "private" or "work" on EROAD's telematics system at the start of each day or the start of each journey. Drivers will get into the **HABIT** of selecting the type of journey they are embarking on.



Allowing drivers to not be tracked on personal time fosters a **RELATIONSHIP OF TRUST** between management and drivers. Disabling tracking on personal trips is not only correct under the law but is courteous as well.
